Choose two pairs of your own shoes. The first is the one you normally wear; the second pair will have lower or higher heels than the shoes you normally wear. For example, heels + boots or walking shoes + sandals. When you arrive at the beginning of the street you will have one pair of shoes on your feet and the other pair in your hands - preferably not in any bag. Before you start walking along the Nieuwstraat, change the shoe on one foot for the corresponding shoe you were carrying. Having unmatching shoes walk halfway down the street or as far as you like. You then exchange the unmatching shoes you were wearing for those shoes you are carrying and walk forward to the end of the street, or as far as you like.

You don't necessarily have to walk down the street from start to finish. Finally, change your shoes back to normal, sit down and have a cup of coffee or tea and rest your feet. Thank yourself for a good performance
