They stay in the circle and count to 10 in their heads.

Then they both calmly walk down Nieuwstraat.

shake hands and say 'Good afternoon.'

They walk on to the intersection where the other started.

They stand in the circle drawn by the other, both with their backs to Nieuwstraat.

Both count to 10 in their heads. Both slowly clap their hands twice. Both continue their day.

I performed Nieuwstraat together with Jolanda. The performance was quite short, but it was interesting to experience the street in this way. We did something that was unusual for us. The actions flowed into each other, repeating themselves several times in our heads beforehand. Then it happened in reality here.
